9.19 (New Standard) 25.09M

9.19

A written directive requires members who conduct background investigations are trained, as defined by the agency, in collecting required information.

Training may be CJSTC, investigative, or other relevant training approved by the agency.

A written directive addresses storage of medications which require refrigeration; and includes:

I. Bullets

- A. When stored in a general-use refrigerator, medications are kept in separate, covered, waterproof, labeled containers;
- B. Refrigerators in which medications are stored are equipped with a thermometer, and the temperature of the refrigerator is maintained between 36 degrees Fahrenheit and 46 degrees Fahrenheit;
- C. Medication refrigerators are cleaned and inspected monthly by medical staff;
- D. Daily temperatures, and monthly cleanings and inspections are documented on a checklist or other form developed by the facility.
- E. A refrigerator temperature log is used to record the interior of the refrigerator daily.

- Maintenance, temperature, and inspection logs demonstrating compliance (Qty Initial: 3) (Qty Reaccred: 1 each year)
