14.12M

A written directive states property custodians are accountable for all inmate property within their control, and addresses the following:

I. Bullets

- A. An annual examination of conformance with agency controls, policies and procedures of the property function is conducted by a member not routinely or directly connected with control of property;
- ~~B. An unannounced inspection of property storage areas for organization and orderliness is conducted as directed by the agency's CEO;~~
- ~~C.B.~~ An annual full or partial inventory, as defined by the agency, of inmate property is conducted by the property custodian or designee and a designee of the CEO; and
- ~~D.C.~~ Follow-up investigative procedures for lost, missing, or stolen inmate property.

- Written directive addressing elements of the standard. (Qty Initial: 1) (Qty Reaccred: 1)
- Documentation demonstrating compliance with each element of the standard. (Qty Initial: 1 each) (Qty Reaccred: 1 each for each year)

Agency policy for inventory must specify amounts or percentages.

Examinations, ~~inspections~~ and inventories are documented separately.

Justification:

Recommend removing current bullet B. This would reorganize the bullet letters, and also remove the word "inspections" under the AM notes. Checking for organization and orderliness should be occurring during Bullet A already, when examining conformance with controls, policies, and procedures. This change would mirror CFA 27.13M, which removed the requirement for the unannounced inspection.

15.04M

A *written directive* addresses housing of inmates identified as being suicidal or a danger to themselves, to include:

I. Bullets

- A. *Direct continuous observation* for inmates housed separately or in single cells;
- B. Documented 15 minute physical observations, regardless of housing; and
- C. Written medical clearance by the physician-~~or~~, designee, or mental health provider prior to the inmate being removed from observation.

II. Proofs of Compliance

- *Written directive* addressing elements of the standard (Qty Initial: 1) (Qty Reaccred: 1)
- Documentation of 15 minute observations (Qty Initial: 3) (Qty Reaccred: 1 each year)
- Documentation of medical clearance by the physician-~~or~~, designee, or mental health provider (Qty Initial: 3) (Qty Reaccred: 1 each year)
- Observation of housing units

Justification:

Some jails contract one entity as a medical healthcare provider and another entity as a mental health provider. The change would allow jails who have mental health providers to avoid having to navigate MOUs between contracted resources and possibly avoid other issues which could arise by having a provider being under the impression they have to be subservient to another. Additionally, the health care provider may be avert to take responsibility for the actions or decisions of someone whom they do not employ.

Adding mental health professional or mental health service providers as approved parties who can provide clearance to inmates on suicide watch will assist jails such as ours.

24.15M

A *written directive* describes *procedures* for inmates to be tested for infectious diseases, and includes:

I. Bullets

- A. Review of test results by a physician, physician assistant, or advanced registered nurse practitioner;
- B. Test results are confidential and shared only with those who have a need to know;
- C. Test results are exempt from the Public Records law; and
- D. Test results become part of the inmates' permanent medical file.

- Documentation demonstrating test completion (Qty Initial: 3) (Qty Reaccred: 1 each year)
